Guest Speakers



We are delighted to welcome Professor Pascal Boileau as our speaker and guest of honour at the 2018 ISES conference.

Professor Boileau is the Professor and Head of the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery and Traumatology at the University of Nice, Sophia-Antipolis. He is also the Vice Dean of Biomedical Research and the President of the Scientific Commission at the University of Nice School of Medicine. He grew up in Metz in the northeast of

France. His orthopaedic training was in Nice, where he was awarded the Ancien Interne Médaille d'Or (Resident's Gold Medal). His fellowship training was with Prof Henri Dejour in Lyons. He was awarded both SOFCOT and SECEC travelling fellowships, allowing him to visit centres for shoulder surgery in the US. In 2005, he was awarded the prestigious Neer Award for his work on the biomechanics of reverse shoulder arthroplasty. In 2007, he won the prize for best clinical paper at the ICSS (International Conference on Shoulder Surgery) with his research on the ISIS score. His practice is based at the Pasteur 2 Hospital, part of the Centre Hospitalier Universitaire de Nice, where he is the director of the Nice Shoulder Institute and the Institut Universitaire Locomoteur et Sport (IULS). He has published widely on rotator cuff pathology, glenohumeral instability and shoulder arthroplasty with well in excess of 100 index-linked articles and over 150 book chapters in print. He is the founder and director of the biennial Nice Shoulder Course. He is married to Dominique and has two children, Marie and Pierre.



Anju is a Consultant Physiotherapist with a clinical interest in

shoulder dysfunction and research & innovation lead for the Therapy directorate at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital (RNOHT). She has worked at the RNOHT for over 20 years, 18 years of which has been in clinical rehabilitation in managing complex shoulder dysfunction with a specific interest in atraumatic shoulder instability. She has lectured internationally and presented at numerous scientific meetings. She has published work in the field of motor control at

the shoulder, co-supervised post graduate student projects and is involved in several funded research studies collaborating with commercial and academic partners, one of which is the NIHR GRASP trial with the University of Oxford. She is currently leading a randomised clinical trial on the role of surgery in atraumatic shoulder instability with the surgical team at the RNOHT in collaboration with Prof Ginn at Sydney University. She holds a clinical teaching fellow post at University College London (UCL) and is program lead for the new UCL MSc in Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation. She has served on the board of the European Society of Shoulder & Elbow Rehabilitation (EUSSE) since 2008 and was President of the society from 2012-2015. She has also served on the British Shoulder & Elbow Society Education committee and is an active member. She has a passion for improving the management of shoulder dysfunction as well as globally promoting physical therapy and rehabilitation.

Mr James Colville

Mr James Colville graduated in Medicine from Trinity College, Dublin. His orthopaedic training was on the Irish national training programme. Following on from this, he completed upper limb fellowships in Heinola, Finland and St Gallen, Switzerland. He was awarded a Shoulder Reconstruction Scholarship in Columbia Medical Centre in New York. During his distinguished career he held the following positions: President of the British Elbow/Shoulder Society, President of the Irish Society for Surgery of the Hand, President Irish Association of Occupational Therapists, Vice Dean of the Faculty of Sports & Exercise Medicine. For many years, he co-chaired the annual Dublin Sports Surgery course. His main area of specialization has been the management of the sports injured shoulder and throughout his career, he carried out in excess of 1500 surgical procedures to treat shoulder instability.
