

WELCOME FROM THE COMMITTEE

Dear Colleagues,

Welcome to the 2019 annual conference of the Irish Shoulder and Elbow Society. The committee would like to express our gratitude to Professor Pascal Boileau and Dr Anju Jaggi, our invited speakers, for making the 2018 meeting an enjoyable and informative one.

In June, we hosted a specialty morning at the Irish Orthopaedic Association annual meeting at the Heritage Hotel and Spa in Killenard. Dr Mark Mighell from the Florida Orthopaedic Institute was our guest of honour, delivering a lecture on the diagnosis and management of prosthetic infection in shoulder arthroplasty. Other speakers on the day included Mr David Morrissey from Cork University Hospital who spoke on the diagnosis and management of sterno-clavicular joint disorders. Mr Ross Kingston from the Bon Secours Hospital in Tralee shared his philosophy on post-operative analgesia and rehabilitation following rotator cuff repair. Mr Muiris Kennedy from the Midlands Regional Hospital outlined his rationale for using the posterior approach for the management of terrible triad injuries and Mr Ronan McKeown from Craigavon Area Hospital shared his experience in the management of AC joint injuries.

Following on from the morning session Dr Mighell delivered a keynote address to the IOA at large on the management of proximal humeral fractures.

This year at the ISES annual meeting, east coast USA meets west, with Dr Evan Flatow visiting from New York and Dr Lori Michener from Los Angeles. Dr Evan Flatow is President of Mount Sinai West, part of the Mount Sinai Health System. Prior to taking up this post and since 2006 he served as the Bernard J. Lasker Professor and Chair of Orthopaedic Surgery at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. At Mt Sinai, he established a research group focused on studying the basic science of tendon healing and pathology. With Dr Bigliani, he developed the widely used Flatow-Bigliani comprehensive shoulder replacement system.

Dr Lori Michener is the Director of Clinical Outcomes and Research, Director of the COOR Laboratory, and Professor of Clinical Physical Therapy at the University of Southern California. The COOR laboratory focuses on the study of the mechanisms, diagnosis and treatment of orthopaedic and sports injuries of the shoulder.

With two such distinguished speakers, we can all look forward to an interesting and educational scientific meeting.




We are delighted to welcome Dr Evan Flatow as our speaker and guest of honour at the 2018 ISES conference.



President, Mount Sinai West

Evan L. Flatow, MD, is President of Mount Sinai West, part of the Mount Sinai Health System. Prior to this appointment, he served since 2006 as the Bernard J. Lasker Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery, Chair of the Leni and Peter W. May Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, and Director of the Orthopaedic Surgery Service at The Mount Sinai Hospital. A nationally and internationally recognized leader in shoulder surgery, he has made

many clinical, educational, and research contributions to the care of shoulder disorders.





basic science research group at Mount Sinai, serving as principal investigator on a National Institutes of Health R01 grant based on a new animal model of tendon damage. Dr. Flatow spent the 11 years previous to joining Mount Sinai on the faculty of Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center. A 1977 graduate of Princeton University, Dr. Flatow received his medical degree from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1981. He completed a surgical residency at Roosevelt Hospital, and an orthopaedic residency and a year of shoulder fellowship under the direction of Charles S. Neer, II, MD, at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center. Dr. Flatow has received numerous honors and awards, and has written or edited five books and more than 170 articles and book chapters. He has served as President of American Shoulder & Elbow Surgeons, Chair of the Trustees of the Journal of Shoulder and Elbow Surgery, and as Chair of the Publications Committee and of the Council on Education of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons.



Lori Michener, PhD, PT, ATC, SCS, FAPTA is the Director of Clinical Outcomes and Research, Director of the COOR Laboratory, and Professor of Clinical Physical Therapy at the University of Southern California. Prior to USC she was a faculty member for 15 years at Virginia Commonwealth University. She earned a B.S. in Athletic Training from Lock Haven University in Pennsylvania as well as a B.S. in Physical Therapy from the State University of New York at

Buffalo, a M.Ed. from the University of Virginia, and her Ph.D. in Orthopedics and Biomechanics from MCP Hahnemann University in Philadelphia, PA. In the COOR (Clinical biomechanics, Orthopedics and sports medicine Outcomes Research) Laboratory her research is focused on the study of mechanisms and the diagnosis and treatment of orthopedic and sports injuries of the shoulder. Specifically, she examines the mechanisms underlying the shoulder pathologies using a variety of techniques to include ultrasonography, kinematics, and EMG (electromyography). In the clinical setting, Lori and her collaborators examine the ability to classify and diagnosis shoulder disorders, and the



outcomes of non-surgical treatment for patients with shoulder and cervical spine disorders. COOR Lab: http://pt.usc.edu/COOR/ Lori was named an APTA Catherine Worthington Fellow in 2015.




Mr James Colville graduated in Medicine from Trinity College, Dublin. His orthopaedic training was on the Irish national training programme. Following on from this, he completed upper limb fellowships in Heinola, Finland and St Galen, Switzerland. He was awarded a Shoulder Reconstruction Scholarship in Columbia

Medical Centre in New York. During his distinguished career he held the following positions: President of the British Elbow/Shoulder Society, President of the Irish Society for Surgery of the Hand, President Irish Association of Occupational Therapists, Vice Dean of the Faculty of Sports & Exercise Medicine. For many years, he co-chaired the annual Dublin Sports Surgery course. His main area of specialization has been the management of the sports injured shoulder and throughout his career, he carried out in excess of 1500 surgical procedures to treat shoulder instability.


